



Fishing Trip



A ten week consultation which began during the week beginning Monday 10 August will gather the views of the public on proposals for a victims and survivors service. The new comprehensive service aims to be responsive to the needs of both individual victims and those groups that work with victims and survivors.

Consultative Group on the Past

Also known as the Eames/Bradley document has been in circulation since January 2009. The document

provides various recommendations in addressing society issues that are at the centre of hurt and healing. These include issues such as reconciliation, truth recovery, victims and survivors and remembering. It also suggests various structures that could be established in order to implement their proposals such as a proposal for a new Legacy Commission and additional roles and tasks for some existing bodies.

The Northern Ireland Office announced in June a three month consultation process on the document which

allows individuals and groups the opportunity to feedback their views and concerns on the recommendations of the report. The deadline for submissions is 2nd October 2009.
